







Thinking Out Loud



Not long ago a well-known magazine held a competition among its readers to list the "eighth deadly sin" and give reason for their suggestions. I don't know what the winning selection was, but a noted theologian said his entry would have been "the sin of sincerity". He went on to state that one of our basic problems today is that everyone sincerely believes his cause to be a righteous one!

I rather suspect this to be true whether it be in the church, a political campaign, a foreign policy, or some special project for social justice and change.

Jesus himself was placed on the cross by sincere people. He demanded more than sincerity from his followers. They were to be his disciples and do their Father's will. When he accused the Pharisees of being hypocrites, he didn't accuse them of insincerity. He meant that they were merely sincere, but not righteous.

As we begin our fall programs and projects, as we return to programs of Christian education, as we engage in evangelism and social mission, as we participate in the election year activities, we must insist that we live our faith so it goes beyond sincerity to truth, wisdom and love. We must strive to have the mind of Christ.

In the final judgment we will not be judged for our sincerity. That will be taken for granted. But we will be judged by the deeds we might have achieved, by the gifts we have wasted and by the service we fail to render!


